Program Learning Outcome	Musical and Technical Expertise of Ensembles
Who Is In Charge?	Ensemble and performance conductors
Direct Assessment Methods	Three external evaluators were asked to report their reviews of the annual Christmas
	Festival using a 4 point Likert scale and optional narrative comments
Indirect Assessment Methods	Music faculty discussions of the performances and the Festival CD, along with
	feedback received from audience members.
Major Findings	The performances at the Festival demonstrated a high degree of musical and
	technical expertise appropriate to the level of the ensembles. The evaluators,
	however, largely abandoned the numerical evaluation criteria requested of them and
	chose to respond in narrative forms that included a lyric poem. The one respondent
	who used the form provided scored the ensembles consistently in the upper range of
	"Developed" to "Highly Developed" with some notations of "Emerging" for the first-
	year choral ensembles, which is an expected level for them at this point in their
	trajectory. The highest artistic and technical achievement ratings were noted in the
	orchestral area, with the strength of the combined choral and orchestral forces being
	close to those.
Closing the Loop Activities	The department reviewed the evaluators findings along with the recordings used to
	produce the Festival CD and affirmed the findings of the evaluators.
Discussion	The department appreciated the input of the external evaluators but recognized that
	they were not comfortable with the process asked of them. It is not surprising that
	those not familiar with the desire for quantifiable results would feel more at ease
	with providing narrative and reflective discussions. The faculty in the end derived

more from those insights than perhaps would have been derived from the purely
numeric results, but having both would have been helpful as well. In future iterations
of this methodology more time should be given to orient the evaluators to the process
requested and the importance of following the procedures outlined

	Some additional emphasis on orchestral participation will be implemented along with using the first-year choral ensemble in collaborative efforts more often than in a solo
	capacity.

Action	Plans for including first-year singers in collaborative performances including the Choral Masterworks program are planned for the 2016-2017 season. The orchestra submitted a performance recording for consideration for a national orchestral festival and was accepted as one of 4 collegiate level orchestras to perform at the Kennedy Center in 2017. Other orchestras so recognized include Ivy league schools such the Brown University Orchestra, affirming the advanced stature of the orchestra's technical and musical development.
